APRIL 30TH, 1920 - FEBRUARY 2ND, 2021 (100 YEARS OLD)

- Born in Keighley, Yorkshire, England.
- Officer in the British Army during WWII, working in Burma.
- After the war, he went home to build houses with his dad.
- Tom married Pamela and had two daughters, Lucy and Hannah.
- To raise money for healthcare workers during the COVID-19 lockdown,
 Moore set a goal of walking around his garden 100 times.
- Received the Pride of Britain Award, the York Medal, a gold Blue Peter Badge, and the title of Knight Bachelor.
- By his 100th birthday, he had raised nearly £40 million!



FAUJA SINGH



APRIL 1ST, 1911 - PRESENT

- Born in Jalandhar, Punjab, India.
- Fauja learned to walk around age 5.
- Moved to England to live near his son at age 81.
- Began running at age 89, running the London Marathon in 2000.
- At 93 he ran a marathon (26.2 miles!) in 6 hours and 54 minutes, setting a world record for the 90-plus age bracket.
- After the Toronto Waterfront Marathon, he became the first 100-year-old to run a full marathon.
- At 100, he achieved eight world records in the Ontario Masters Association International Meet.
- Fauja retired from running in 2013 at age 101 after running the Hong Kong marathon.

MARY WALKER




1848 - 1969 (121 YEARS OLD)

- Born in Union Springs, Alabama, Mary was enslaved from birth.
- Freed from slavery in 1863 at age 15.
- At 20, Mary was married and had her first child.
- She moved to Chattanooga, Tennessee in 1917.
- To support her family, she worked as a sharecropper and did odd jobs.
- At 114, she was the last living member of her family.
- Mary enrolled in a literacy course at 116 to learn to read.
- She was certified as America's oldest student by the US Department of Health, Education, and Welfare.


SARAH LOUISE "SADIE" DELANY



SEPTEMBER 19TH, 1889 - JANUARY 25TH, 1999 (109 YEARS OLD)

- Born in Lynch Station, Virginia.
- Raised in Raleigh, North Carolina where her father was Vice Principal of St. Augustine's School.
- Growing up, she was best friends with her sister Bessie.
- Sadie and Bessie went to school together, worked together at a farm, and spent lots of time with family.
- During their childhood, they experienced racism living in America after the Civil War.
- In 1916, she moved to New York City to attend Pratt Institute and Columbia University.
- She received her Bachelor's degree in education in 1920.
- She received her Master's in education in 1925.
- She was the first black person permitted to teach domestic science at the high school.
- She worked with her sister to organize civil rights protests & marches.

ANNIE ELIZABETH "BESSIE" DELANY






SEPTEMBER 3RD, 1891 - SEPTEMBER 25TH, 1995 (104 YEARS OLD)

- Born on the campus of St Augustine's School in Raleigh, North Carolina where her father was Vice Principal.
- Growing up, she was best friends with her sister Sadie.
- Sadie and Bessie went to school together, worked together at a farm, and spent lots of time with family.
- During their childhood, they experienced racism living in America after the Civil War.
- In 1918 she moved near her sister in New York City.
- She enrolled in Columbia University and earned a dental degree in 1923.
- She was the only black woman in her graduating class.
- Bessie and her brother operated a dental practice together in Harlem, NYC.
- She worked with her sister to organize civil rights protests & marches, and encouraged activists to meet at their dental office.



VIRGINIA OLIVER



JUNE 6TH, 1920 - PRESENT

- Born in Rockland, Maine.
- She learned to lobster fish with her father at 8 years old.
- Married another lobster fisher, Max Oliver and had 4 children.
- Virginia and her husband ran a lobster fishing business for 61 years, and 3 of her children became fishers.
- Since her husband's death, Virginia continues to fish for lobster with her son Max Jr.
- She's had over 95 seasons of lobster fishing!
